

2018 WWF Conservation Achievement Awards

Award Nomination Guidelines

Eligibility to be nominated:

1. Nominee should have shown outstanding conservation effort and achievement in Wisconsin Natural Resources in the last year.
2. Emphasis should generally be on the nominee's recent work
3. Most nominees are individuals, but in some cases teams, organizations, or collaborations may be appropriate.

Nomination should consist of:

- Nominees' name, institution, and contact information to include: address, phone, and email.
- Name and contact information of individual making nomination.
- Type or Award Name recommended for recognition
 - Please see category outline for award categories
- Nomination letter evaluating the nominee's qualifications, specific work, or achievement to be recognized. Please include what the nominee did (projects, activities), how they completed the work and what the results and/or impact their work has had on conservation.
 - In addition to contact info; **Letter should be no more than two type written pages.**
- Nomination should be received in the WWF office no later than **March 15th**.
 - Emailed submissions preferred. Email to office@wiwf.org

Nomination review, selection and notification

- After the nomination deadline (**March 15th**) the WWF Awards Committee will begin review and selection process.
- WWF has the right to reject any or all nominations.
- WWF has the right to select award recipients for all or just a few categories presented, based on nominations received.
- After award recipients are chosen, the recipient will receive notification from a representative of WWF.
 - Award recipients will be invited to the WWF Annual Meeting/Conservation Awards Ceremony in April of the given year to receive the recognition/award.
- WWF reserves the right to announce award recipients on their web site, social media, newspaper, and other media.
